2019 Scholarship Guidelines

National Mutual Benefit continues to promote its commitment of giving back to others through volunteer service. These scholarships were created to inspire young adults to learn the value of volunteerism and be encouraged to continue those efforts through college and into their adult life.

The 2019 National Scholarship Benefit program will award up to \$32,000 for the 2019–2020 academic year. Two President's Scholarships for \$2,000 each will be awarded—one to a graduating high school senior and one to a current college student.

To apply, you must:

- Be a member of National Mutual Benefit, insured under your own life insurance or annuity contract, by February 28, 2019;
- Be a graduating high school senior in the class of 2019 continuing your education, or a student enrolled full-time in 2019-2020 in an accredited undergraduate program or technical degree program in the United States;
- Be age 25 or younger by September 1, 2019; and
- Provide information regarding your 2018 volunteer activities.
